

New Castle Multimodal Regional Riverwalk Project

Description: The City of New Castle is implementing the 2nd phase of a multi-phase Regional Riverwalk project. The overall project will replace deteriorated infrastructure to create a pedestrian and bicycle friendly environment that is well connected to existing infrastructure and new access points. The deteriorated and antiquated infrastructure is negatively impacting pedestrian and bicycle circulation, safety and connectivity to public transportation, the central business district, and regional employers. The result will also include a more livable and walkable region promoting economic development, home ownership, tourism, healthy living and improving the quality of life and system reliability.

The scope of work for the 2nd phase includes: a continuous system of safe and secure multi-modal connectivity through new sidewalks, crosswalks, ADA accessible ramps, public transportation stops and kiosks, bicycle racks, all making downtown more universally accessible. Electrical upgrades, new curbs, designated bicycle lanes, and gutters and driveway aprons per ADA standards will provide a safe separation between pedestrian walk areas, bicycle lanes & vehicular street traffic to create a safe pedestrian experience. This project builds upon the 1st phase which was implemented with funding from SPC's Livability through Smart Transportation Program, which assisted in funding the creation of a pedestrian and bicycle friendly environment along N. Croton Ave. (SR108) and the county-owned North Street Bridge that will serve as a connector for the County's Neshannock trail system to downtown New Castle.
